What I think maybe the government doesn't take into consideration is there is a huge number of Australians who while they don't make themselves heard, they are being overlooked in a significant way by the extremely loud noises from minority groups who try to press their views on everyone else.

I noted with interest, that an increase has been registered of 26% from 2017 to 2021 and that it was registered that volunteering has declined over the last decade before COVID-19.
