STANDARDS AND ACCREDITATION STUDY SUBMISSION

RADIOLOGY ACCREDITATION

Pennant Hills Diagnostic Centre was the first private radiology practice in Australia to achieve Stage 3 (full ISO accreditation), two hospitals achieved this prior. Pennant Hills Diagnostic Centre is a fully comprehensive practice encompassing the modalities of x-ray, ultrasound, C.T., DEXA, mammography and MRI. Nuclear medicine was previously performed at this site but has recently been discontinued because of rising costs.

To date the implementation of x-ray accreditation by other facilities has been pitiful – not meeting objectives.

This can be attributed to the following:-

- The high costs in achieving this (see attachment 1 for costs of implementing this at PHDC). This include manpower hours.
- The costs of actual accreditation (see attachment 2)
- The ongoing costs to continue membership NATA (see attachment 3)
- The actual competition disadvantage that this puts on accredited practice under, because of costly and time consuming protocols required by accredited practices.
- The inability to recoup costs of accreditation because of Radiology capped budget and the public perception that medicine "is free", thereby preventing addition of added charge for quality service.
- The captive markets that the corporate radiology practices control.
- The lack of an international market.
- The inability, because of radiology's unique nature, to increase productivity further. All examinations need to be channelled through the radiologist.

- The radiologist's capacity to do accurate reporting/studies is finite.
- Inability to obtain insurance at a lower premium despite NATA Accreditation (as claimed by NATA).
- The reluctance to allow further control of severely government controlled industry to continue further.

SOLUTION:

Practices which do achieve accreditation need to be rewarded to allow recoup of costs and increased profitability.

This should include practice grants, increased medicare benefits, NATA membership on a sliding scale i.e. decrease in membership costs for each year of membership.
