VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (CHAPTER 5)

- In 2006, the Australian and State and Territory governments provided \$4.2 billion of recurrent expenditure for Vocational Education and Training (VET) (p. 5.3).
- Nationally, 1.2 million people participated in training funded from government recurrent revenue (p. 5.5). The participation rate in government-funded training for 15-64 year olds was 8.2 per cent (p. 5.14). (These figures do not include all students undertaking accredited training. For example, many students undertake training not funded by government.)
- These government funded students completed over 294.4 million hours of VET programs delivered by technical and further education (TAFE) institutes, other government providers, universities, community organisations and private providers, at 10 975 locations (pp. 5.5-6).


Objectives of vocational education and training

Shaping our Future — Australia's National Strategy for Vocational Education and Training 2004–2010 details the objectives for VET (p. 5.11):


- industry will have a highly skilled workforce to support strong performance in the global economy
- employers and individuals will be at the centre of vocational education and training
- communities and regions will be strengthened economically and socially through learning and employment
- Indigenous Australians will have skills for viable jobs and their learning culture will be shared.

Government real recurrent expenditure per annual hour (2006 dollars)^a (p. 5.22-23)


